**Students** are learning about careers and making informed decisions about their futures.

Last year **nearly 1,800** students prepared for college and careers through Roads to Success lessons. **Almost 1,200** students gained hands-on experience in STEM activities such as summer camps and robotics competitions.

**More than 4,500** students explored careers and mapped their futures through career fairs.



Counselors and career advisors are helping students build pathways to college and careers.

**About 125 counselors and career advisors** delivered college and career planning lessons, helped teachers to infuse career preparation in their classrooms, and coordinated job shadows, workplace

tours, and career fairs.



# **Teachers and school leaders** are learning new educational practices to improve student outcomes.

### Approximately 2,300 teachers and more than 300 school leaders

participated in activities to improve classroom instruction and strengthen content expertise in math, writing, and other subjects.

**Businesses** are informing students and educators about 21st century workforce needs.


**businesses** supported students through career fairs, job shadows, and internships. Businesses also hosted teacher tours and advised program development.

#### Regional Education Associations: Building Succeed 2020 Every Day, Across the State

A regional education association (REA) is a group of school districts seeking to improve their educational programs and services through cooperation and pooling of resources. The REAs serve 97 percent of all North Dakota's public schools and more than 100,000 students.

REAs, with the support of state and local partners, implement Succeed 2020 activities to meet the needs of students, schools, and communities.



# Strengthening learning in the classroom...

Succeed 2020 is supporting teachers and administrators in a variety of ways. Teachers are becoming more effective educators, and administrators are becoming stronger leaders.

#### **EXAMPLES OF SUCCESS:**

- ► Missouri River Education
  Cooperative (MREC, based in
  Mandan): Schools that participated in professional learning communities saw a nearly three percent increase in students scoring proficient or higher on the ND state assessment in reading and more than a four percent increase in students scoring proficient or higher on ND state assessment in math.
- ▶ Mid Dakota Education Cooperative (MDEC, based in Minot): Almost 95 percent of the 115 educators who participated in more than 14 hours of professional development activities reported an improvement of their instructional strategies.

The number of districts not only participating in Succeed 2020 activities but also actively seeking our assistance has increased at least twofold since the inception of Succeed 2020.

- ➤ SouthEast Education Cooperative (SEEC, based in Fargo): More than 75 percent of teachers that participated in Just in Time Math training reported the ability to differentiate instruction for all learners.

  that they learned about researchbased instructional strategies
  to assist students in meeting
  rigorous academic standards.

  educators trained in the use of
  data walls learned how to use data
  to change their instruction.

### Helping students make informed decisions...

Students benefit when their classroom experiences connect with their college and career aspirations. Through Succeed 2020, middle and high school students learn about careers and the paths to make it to those careers.

#### **EXAMPLES OF SUCCESS:**

- ► Great Northwest Education
  Cooperatives (GNWEC, based in
  Williston): More than 25 percent
  of students participating in a
  career fair reported they should
  change their course schedules to
  align with their career goals.
- ➤ North Central Education
  Cooperative (NCEC, based
  in Bottineau): More than 70
  percent of students participating
  in career fair reported they
  learned about new careers.
- ► RRVEC (based in Grand Forks): More than 98 percent of 538 Northern Valley Career Expo

participants felt the Expo will help determine their career pathways.

► MREC (based in Mandan):

More than 80 percent of students participating in the First Tech Challenge, a robotics competition, reported increased skills in teamwork, problem-solving, and time management.

► MDEC (based in Minot): Students prepared for the world of work through 25 job shadows and 14 internships.

More than 90 percent of school and district survey respondents indicated that REA staff members worked to address the needs of students and teachers in their schools effectively.

## Supporting students in their communities...

Local needs drive all Succeed 2020 activities. While there are commonalities across the state, each program is designed to meet student needs in the particular communities served by each REA.

#### **EXAMPLES OF SUCCESS:**

► NCEC (based in Bottineau):

The number of students that
earned the ND CTE scholarship
(worth \$6,000 per student)
climbed from 30 in 2014 to 57 in

2015 due to increased WorkKeys

► RESP (based in Dickinson):
At the end of the school year, 92
percent of students participating
in the transitions program were in
good academic standing.

testing facilitated by NCEC.

► GNWEC (based in Williston):

The Exploration of Petroleum
Industry Careers course provided
students with the opportunity to
receive hands-on experience at a
training rig.

- ▶ NESC (based in Devils Lake): All 5th through 8th grade students in a high-need school district received academic and career counseling. Teachers reported their students learned study skills and responsibility.
- ▶ SEEC (based in Fargo): Operated by the Fargo-West Fargo Indian Education Center, the Check and Connect program served 83 Native American students in four middle schools and four high schools. Five mentors conducted 933 meetings with participating Native American students throughout the school year.

I am amazed at the progress and evolution of the REAs, how they have grown and the range and depth of service they are providing to combine resources and leverage funding for ND teachers and students. This evolution has been accelerated and enhanced by the Succeed 2020 funding.
